

Cumberland County Fair Jr. Miss Pageant 2018 General Rules

1. Contestants for the Jr. Miss Cumberland County Fair Queen Pageant must be between the ages of 13-15 years. She must be 13 years of age by the actual day of the pageant or not have reached her 16th birthday by the pageant date.
2. Contestants must be a resident of Cumberland County, Illinois for at least 6 months or attend a school in Cumberland County.
3. Contestants for Jr. Miss Cumberland County Fair queen must be a single female; never have been married or had a marriage annulled; contestants can never have been pregnant.
4. Contestants must be of good moral character; never been convicted of a crime or have had any criminal charges pending against them. Contestants should not have engaged in any activities that are characterized as dishonest, immoral or indecent.
5. Contestants must be sponsored by a business, firm or organization located in Cumberland County.
6. The sponsor agrees to pay the \$75.00 entry fee per contestant. **Please make checks payable to Cumberland County Fair.** Sponsor will be recognized in the pageant brochure and announced on stage during the pageant.
7. Practices will be closed practices. All cell phones should be turned off. Final rehearsal is required - No Exceptions. (As July and August weather typically is, practices will be very warm. Feel free to bring bottled water to stay hydrated.)
8. Contestants agree be judged on a three minute personal interview with judges, formal wear, a one minute speech on stage, and a pop question on stage. Age appropriate attire for pageant:
 - Interview & Speech –
 - Dress (shoulders must be covered. Should be no more than one or two inches above knee.)
 - Heels (no higher than 3 inches)
 - No open toed or peep toe shoes
 - No platform shoes
 - Formal Wear -
 - Full length formal gown
 - No hi-low dresses
 - No form fitting dresses
 - No cut outs
 - No plunging necklines
 - No slits higher than 2 inches above the knee

Heels (no higher than 3 inches)
No platform shoes
Dance - will not be judged
T-shirt (will be supplied)
Shorts

9. No parents, family or friends will be allowed in the dressing rooms the night of pageant. We want them to be able to enjoy the show. Only the directors and the assistant that they have appointed to you will be allowed in the dressing room. No cell phones or cameras will be allowed either.
10. Contestants understand and agree that any visible body piercing will not be worn while representing the pageant in any capacity. However, jewelry appearing in the ear lobe will be permitted. Limited to only one piercing per lobe. All others will be removed.
11. No visible tattoos.
12. Contestants, as well as the Jr. Miss Queen, will NOT defame the pageant, the Cumberland County Fair, the pageant directors and/or committee, ANY of the pageant contestants, and/or ANY Cumberland County Queen, past, present or future, through any actions, whether it is oral, written or physical, during or after the pageant.
13. All contestants agree to sell at least 25-50/50 raffle tickets and 25 gun raffle tickets prior to the pageant to help cover pageant expenses. Raffles will be drawn during the pageant. Contestants also agree to participate in fairgrounds clean-up day.
14. Social Media/ Networks like Facebook, Twitter, InstaGram, Snap Chat, etc. are popular in today's society. Because of this, your pictures and/or comments can be looked at by anyone. Since you are representing Cumberland County, all pictures and comments on these sites should be respectful and tasteful. If a contestant or the Jr. Miss Queen is found out to have inappropriate pictures or comments you could be disqualified from the contest and/or the title can and will be taken away.
15. The newly crowned Jr. Miss Queen will spend the week (school permitting), alongside of Miss Cumberland County, as a hostess for the fair and agrees to participate in functions becoming of a Queen which may arise during the year. All personal appearances as Jr. Miss Cumberland County Fair Queen or a contestant of the pageant shall be approved in advance by the Pageant Director; as well as any photographic sessions and pictures released as a contestant or role of Jr. Miss Cumberland County Fair Queen. The Jr. Miss Queen must be accompanied by a chaperone at all times during the week of the fair and at any personal appearances when she is wearing her crown. The Jr. Miss Queen will be accompanied by the Pageant Director or a chaperone approved by the director at any time she is representing the Cumberland County Fair. (When making public appearances, no

jeans are permitted without approval).

16. While representing Cumberland County at any event, the Jr. Miss Queen shall refrain from texting or talking on the cell phone unless excused by the director. It looks very rude.
17. The Jr. Miss Queen will abstain from public displays of affection towards her boyfriend during the week of the Fair or at any function.
18. Illegal drugs, alcohol and smoking will definitely not be tolerated. The Contestants and/or Jr. Miss Queen will not partake of drugs, alcoholic beverages and will refrain from smoking while representing the Cumberland County Fair.
19. If for any reason the Jr. Miss Queen cannot fulfill her duties and obligations, she must relinquish the crown and title to the next eligible contestant in line. She must also return ALL gifts and cash prizes.
- 20. All contestants must agree that the decision of the judges is final.**
21. These rules can and will be changed at any time by the Pageant Directors when and if necessary.
